# CHANCES AND SERVICES FOR YOUTH FUTURE

A Vision of the Future of Child Care.



Chances and Services for Youth is embarking on a journey to better child care accessibility and quality in West Central Indiana. In 2023, CASY began the planning phase of establishing their own child care facility in Terre Haute, Indiana.



The center would be constructed by renovating a former warehouse, allowing for plenty of space for children from newborn to five years old. With renovations costing an estimated \$7 million, CASY is currently in the process of fundraising to help make this dream a reality.

The center, once completed, will add a total of 288 child care spots in Vigo County, 192 in the first phase and 96 in the second phase. The center would also work to earn a Level 4 PTQ rating, ensuring it is a high quality facility. The

center will also require 50 employees to ensure child care services are able to run smoothly and at top capacity.

Child care impacts all facets of life. Quality of life, workforce, economic development, talent retention, and more are impacted by a community's ability to provide consistent and high quality child care. We are excited for the future of child care in our region and can't wait to see every child in our counties be served, from cradle to college.



# BIG BROTHERS BIG SISTERS OF THE WABASH VALLEY

Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Wabash Valley changes lives for the better, forever. BBBS provides children in the Wabash Valley with strong and enduring, professionally supported one-to-one mentoring relationships with a caring adult. This impactful and generationally changing program brings enrichment for Bigs and Littles alike.

In 2023, CASY held the 14th annual Crew for Kids! During this event, \$5,410.95 was raised for Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Wabash Valley. Adding to the excitement, the annual Bowl for Kids' Sake event was able to raise \$15,626 across Clay, Parke, Sullivan, Vermillion, and Vigo Counties.

BBBS was also able to host the 1st Annual Music at the Crossroads event in September where bands such as Jed Harrelson, the Big Fun Band, and Marc Rogers Band performed!

This program grows larger each year with more community organizations helping to ensure that every child has a happy holiday season.

In 2023, CASY teamed up with students from Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology to support our annual community service project that provides children with bicycles and helmets during the holidays. The goal of Bikes for Tykes is to ensure that children in the Wabash Valley who are in need of a bicycle will have one for the holiday season. By providing bikes to kids in need, this program gives children a form of independence and responsibility and increases their self-esteem, while fighting childhood obesity.

# CHILD & ADULT CARE FOOD PROGRAM

Making a lasting impact on the health and wellness of children within our community for over 30 years.

The CASY Food Program is a sponsor of the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) for licensed Family Child Care Homes, a site for the At-Risk After-School Meal Program and an operator of the Summer Food Service Programs (SFSP) within our community. All programs are federally funded by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and administered by the Indiana Department of Education (IDOE).

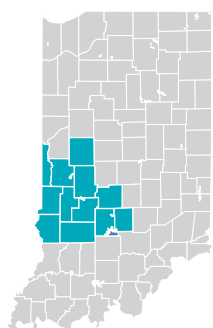
These nutrition programs serve children from birth to high school graduation. They provide funding to enrolled child care and school-age facilities in order to supplement the costs of providing healthy meals and snacks to our communities' children. This investment in our children's health and well-being results in healthy eating habits that last a lifetime with the added benefit of improving the quality of child care and youth programs.

Throughout the year, CASY Food Program staff worked with our CACFP, At Risk and SFSP-enrolled facilities to ensure program success by conducting reviews, technical, trainings and consultations. Through meal planning guidance, new recipes, nutrition education and meal reimbursements, CASY Food Program staff assists enrolled facilities in purchasing and providing nutritious meals and snacks to the children within our community. Meanwhile, working families are assured their children will receive nutritious meals and establish healthy habits when attending a CASY Food Program enrolled facility.



**The Summer Meal Program provided lunches to our week-long campers. We had twenty children on scholarship, so they benefited from not having to spend money for special meals outside the home. I believe it helped us start our programs on time. Rushed and stressed parents didn't have to struggle with making a nutritious sack lunch as they dropped their children off before heading to work, so their arrival was timelier. # CHILD CARE RESOURCE AND REFERRAL

Connecting parents, early education programs, community partners and key stakeholders

As part of the Child Care Resource and Referral Network, Chances and Services for Youth (CASY), works alongside a system of state partners to serve Indiana children and families and create access to high-quality early educational opportunities.

## Child Care and Resource and Referral Key Areas of Support

**Family Education and Referral Support:** Our team of Family Engagement Specialists work to connect families to child care designed to meet their individual needs. We help families understand what to look for in quality care and encourage families to advocate for quality. Through family navigation services, we connect families to resources that support and strengthen every member.

**Program Services:** As we shift away from our work to support emerging programs, we are excited to expand our support of current child care programs through the implementation of Family Child Care Networks. These networking opportunities will be focused on providing peer-to-peer mentoring, business support for sustainability, and connections to resources both at a state and local level. These networking opportunities, along with child care provider resource fairs, will connect programs to the resources they need to sustain and grow their businesses.

**Public Awareness and Engagement:** CCR&R works to support communities in finding innovative ways to sustain current capacity, expand capacity, and increase overall quality. We support communities in developing strategies and strategic plans, the development of grant opportunities, and by being a voice for early care and education across our service area. CCR&R looks forward to more opportunities to share the impacts of early care and education.

**Data Collection and Assessment:** CCR&R agencies design methods to assess the needs of their communities; use state and federal statistics; develop plans for their communities based on the needs and data; and conduct annual quantitative and qualitative reports to share information on the services offered and their impacts.

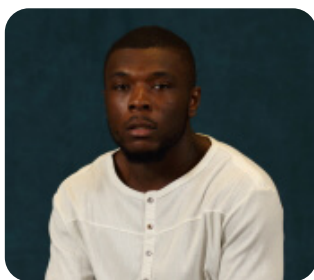

# ILEAD YOUTH LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

Building leadership and personal growth through youth-driven services and hands-on experiences.



An important subset of our coalition is our youth coalition called iLead. This youth-driven program focuses on leadership development and personal growth through unique and engaging experiences. “iLEAD Because My VOICE Matters” believes teen leadership development and peer-to-peer

education is the best model for developing effective resistance skills regarding tobacco, drug, and alcohol prevention. iLEAD partners with VOICE, the Tobacco Prevention & Cessation movement designed by youth, for youth to promote a tobacco/vape-free lifestyle.

## 2023 Accomplishments

Over 200 lbs. of unused, unwanted, expired prescription drugs were collected at our **DRUG TAKE BACK DAY EVENT**, in April and October.

In August, September, and October of 2023 **CASY LAUNCHED A VIDEO CAMPAIGN** of iLEAD-created videos on the dangers of vaping. On average, each video was seen 340,000 times!

**PROVIDED A COMMUNITY ASSESSMENT** to illustrate to our community and its leaders the important relationship between anti-drug coalition work and the community's stated priorities.

In partnership with Tobacco Free Vigo, DFVC youth coalition, iLEAD, **HELPED TO AMEND THE CITY AND COUNTY ORDINANCE** to include vaping/e-cigarette products.

**9 ILEAD YOUTH ATTENDED THE CADCA FORUM IN WASHINGTON DC** to learn strategies to become advocates for substance use/misuse prevention in their community.

**PARTNERED WITH VIGO COUNTY SCHOOL CORPORATION** to conduct the Indiana Youth Survey annually.

In June 2023, the coalition **HOSTED 35 YOUTH AT THE YOUTH LEADERSHIP SUMMIT** at Saint Mary of the Woods College. The summit focuses on youth empowerment and substance use prevention.

iLEAD youth coalition member served as the **STATE VOICE YOUTH AMBASSADOR**.

Developed new partnerships with **VIGO COUNTY DRUG ENDANGERED CHILDREN ALLIANCE** and other organizations in the community.



# CAMP RAVE SUMMER CAMP

Offering summertime experiences for kids that are safe, fun, engaging, and enriching.



Camp RAVE Summer Camp includes environmental discovery, arts, character development, literacy, health and wellness and much more! The goal of Camp RAVE is to prevent summer learning loss and strengthen children's decision-making skills through unique, engaging activities.

Camp RAVE collaborates with the Vigo County Purdue Extension office to create hands-on activities such as gardening, woodworking, field trips, college visits and an introduction to 4-H. The camp is open to all kindergarten through fifth-grade students at the low cost of \$80 per week. Scholarships are available to assist families with financial needs.

# WABASH VALLEY LEMONADE DAY

Inspiring youth entrepreneurs to work hard, make profit, and give back to the community.

Since 2012, Lemonade Day has sought to help the youth of Vigo County become the business leaders, social advocates, community leaders, and forward-thinking citizens of tomorrow – one lemonade stand at a time!

Lemonade Day is a fun, experiential program that teaches youth how to start, own and operate their very own business – a lemonade stand. In 2023, 200 youth participated in Wabash Valley Lemonade Day to learn about financial literacy, career readiness, and entrepreneurship.

In 2023, CASY also hosted its first ever Bank Loan Day and Brand Your Stand event! These events were opportunities to teach young children additional skills associated with running a business. Participants were able to “take out a loan” from CASY for their lemonade stand supplies and then were taught the basics of business marketing to make their stand a

success! Thank you to the Hometown Savings Bank for their donation that made the bank loans for kids possible!

Congratulations to Chase X who was named the 2023 Entrepreneur of the Year! Chase participated in the Brand Your Stand Event, was the winner of the design contest, and had a ribbon cutting at The Station on Lemonade Day with the previous Mayor of Terre Haute, Duke Bennett.

We also want to thank the Indiana Economic Development Corporation (IEDC) who generously granted CASY \$10,000 to support Wabash Valley Lemonade Day! This initiative empowers our young entrepreneurs, allowing elementary students to dive into the world of business. From small business training, to securing a business loan with a local bank, our future business leaders get a taste of what it's like to run their own business venture.

# BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL CARE

Providing a safe, fun, and enriching environment before and after school.

Before and After School Care ensures that Vigo County children have a safe, fun, and enriching environment to learn and grow before and after the school bell rings! Before and After School Care is open to all kindergarten through fifth-grade students. Transportation by CASY staff is provided to and from Davis Park Elementary while the Vigo County School Corporation provides transportation to and from Sugar Grove, Farrington Grove, and Fuqua Elementary.

The program is designed to create hands-on learning experiences and strengthen life skills and decision-making. The Vigo County School Corporation and the 21st Century Grant Program are partnered with CASY to bring educational curriculum and special guest speakers to the program. Before and After School Care also partners with Purdue Extension, the Terre Haute Children's Museum, and the YMCA of the Wabash Valley to provide fun learning opportunities.

During program time, children benefit from supervised enrichment activities, homework help from a licensed Vigo County School teacher, and an afternoon meal. For the 2023 school year, 80 children were served in the program.

## SAFE KIDS OF VIGO COUNTY

Providing education, programming, and support with one common goal: To keep your children safe.

Safe Kids of Vigo County has one common goal: keeping your children safe. Our dedicated staff provides support initiatives based on the needs of our community. Safe Kids of Vigo County, supported by Union Health, implements evidence-based programs such as car seat checks and distribution events, safety workshops and clinics and community education programs that help parents and caregivers prevent childhood injuries.

### Safety Assistance from Safe Kids

Safe Kids' certified Child Passenger Safety Technicians are available to train parents and caregivers to select, install and adjust car seats and booster seats. They will:

- Provide assistance in obtaining car seats for individuals who meet the program's qualifications;
- Help parents or caregivers who already have child safety restraints to assure in the proper installation and adjustment of car seats and booster seats; and
- Advise parents and caregivers about when a child is the right size to move from a child restraint to an adult safety belt. .

# HEALTHY START

Strengthening families before, during, and after pregnancy within the Wabash Valley.



CASY is dedicated to ensuring the health of women, infants and families throughout Wabash Valley. To that end, CASY has partnered with the All Babies Initiative (ABI), which seeks to address Wabash Valley's high infant mortality rate and assist providers, organizations, and families to improve the health of our community. CASY also employs two community health workers to further enhance this mission. As ABI community health workers, we seek event opportunities in our serving counties (Vigo, Parke, Vermillion, and Fountain County) and attend community outreach opportunities. In 2023, we attended 24 community events representing ABI.

In addition to our partnership with ABI, we also have a partnership with Union Health Foundation to conduct Healthy Home Assessment. CASY has completed a certification to become certified Healthy Home assessors helping families identify environmental health hazards within their own homes. The All Babies Healthy Homes Initiative seeks to improve the living environments of pregnant and parenting families, reduce hospital admissions related to unhealthy homes, and increase awareness of environmental health factors and how they impact the health and well-being of the Wabash Valley community. Healthy Start also partners with the local fire department to ensure the proper installation of smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors. In 2023, 10 homes received brand-new, correctly installed smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors.

To further our outreach, CASY leadership has facilitated the quarterly CAN (Community Action Network) Meetings. These meetings are attended by community organizations serving families in the Wabash Valley working towards the same goal - to lower infant mortality and improve the health of families in the Wabash Valley.

Lastly, as CPST (Child Passenger Safety Technicians) and community health workers, CASY seeks to educate participants on proper child passenger safety while on home visits and assist with correct installation of car seats. In 2023, 34 home visits were conducted giving child passenger safety education to families and caregivers.

## DADS MATTER COALITION

Bringing awareness about the importance of the role fathers fill in their family

CASY COO Brandon Halleck sits as a co-chairman on the Dads Matter Coalition (DMC). The DMC is a Volunteer-Led community group working in collaboration with the All-Babies Initiative to encourage and support Dads in the Wabash Valley. They aim to support Wabash Valley fathers and father programs by educating the community, hosting events, and partnering with local organizations to provide an avenue for Dads to interact with their kids.

In 2023, CASY assisted with planning events for the DMC, including a Dad's Night Out at The Rex Game during Father's Day weekend. CASY also aided in planning for ABI participant events with other ABI staff. These included graduation events, P.A.T.S, and Food RX.

# TOBACCO AND CESSATION PROGRAM

Promoting Prevention and Cessation Program



Each year, Tobacco Prevention and Cessation (TPC) Coordinators offer education and resources to thousands of youths, employers and employees, healthcare providers, nonprofits, early education and child care programs, and college students in the Wabash Valley. Over 200 individuals die from smoking-related illnesses in Vigo County every year. Local TPC Coordinators work to make lasting changes in the health of our community.

## Highlights from 2023:

**EXPANDED THE CITY AND COUNTY SMOKING ORDINANCES** to include electronic devices (e-cigarettes and vapes).

**RENEWED FUNDING FOR THE PROGRAM** through the Indiana Department of Health TPC program. The new grant allocates funding through 2025.

VOICE program member was appointed as a **STATE VOICE YOUTH AMBASSADOR**.

CASY TPC was invited to attend the Global Gaming Expo in Las Vegas, NV as a **REPRESENTATIVE FOR THE COMMUNITY WITH A SMOKE-FREE CASINO**.

## Our twelve performance indicators focus on priorities in the following areas:

**1 Decreasing youth smoking rates:** Presenting to over 500 fifth graders during Red Ribbon Week, educating teachers and students about the dangers of youth tobacco use. Supporting iLead/VOICE program to empower youth to advocate for themselves and expose big tobacco's influence to local and state legislators.

**2 Increasing protections from secondhand smoke:** Working through hospitals and county Head Start programs to promote smoke-free air and the dangers to pregnant women and children. Train Head Start family navigators to work with client families and present the Breathe program to parents. Expanding smoking ordinances in both city and county to further protect the community from the hazards of secondhand smoke.

**3 Decreasing adult smoking rates:** Promotion of the state Quitline as the most effective tool to assist individuals in smoking cessation. Development and delivery of quit kits to healthcare providers and social services organizations to distribute to patients and clients looking to quit. Instructing healthcare professionals on the "Ask, Advise, Refer" process to increase patient participation in QNI programs.

**4 Maintaining infrastructure:** Working with an engaged coalition to broaden our reach in the community and create TPC champions. Connecting with local agencies (NAACP, IYI, MHA, CAN, CRA) to educate about TPC resources and create partnerships to effect change. Presentation at events supporting diverse populations throughout the Valley.

## Facts:

In the last two years, we have **REDUCED** the percentage of pregnant women in Vigo County who smoke **FROM 18% TO 10.3%.**

Smokers who use the Quitline resources to quit **HAVE A 37% SUCCESS RATE.** Those who do not use the resources have a success rate of 7% - 9%.

Vigo County is one of only six counties in the state and Terre Haute is one of only 21 cities with **STRONG SMOKE-FREE AIR ORDINANCES.**



# TEEN COURT

Offering first time youth offenders a second chance.

Teen Court is a volunteer program that allows misdemeanor offenders an alternative to the juvenile criminal justice system. Young offenders are referred to Teen Court from Juvenile Probation and appear before a court of their peers. They are sentenced by a jury of their peers and offered an opportunity to give back to their community for their offenses. We provide an opportunity for youth to serve the community and themselves through proactive citizenship, responsibility, integrity, accountability, and empathy.

## TOO GOOD FOR DRUGS

Too Good for Drugs is an evidence-based school prevention program for kindergarten through 12th grade that builds students' resiliency by teaching them how to be socially competent and autonomous problem solvers. The program is designed to benefit everyone in the school by providing needed education in social and emotional competencies and by reducing risk factors and building protective factors that affect students in these age groups.

Too Good for Drugs focuses on developing personal and interpersonal skills to resist peer pressures, strengthening goal setting, decision-making, bonding with others, having respect for self and others, managing emotions, effective communication, and social interactions. The program also provides information about the negative consequences of drug use and the benefits of a nonviolent, drug-free lifestyle.

# DRUG FREE VIGO COUNTY

Reducing and preventing youth substance abuse by increasing community collaboration, engaging youth in positive social activities, providing education and more.



Drug Free Vigo County is a community-based coalition dedicated to educating the community about alcohol and other drug problems, assessing local needs as well as initiating, coordinating, and implementing comprehensive local plans. Drug Free Vigo County is a federal Drug Free Communities grant recipient from the Office of National Drug Control Policy. The grant allows the coalition to focus on reducing underage drinking and substance abuse. The coalition was established in 1989, as

The Local Coordinating Council (LCC). In 2018, Drug Free Vigo County unveiled its new name and a new logo to better align the coalition with the mission.

Drug Free Vigo County facilitates several events throughout the year. The National Prescription Drug Take Back event is a national effort that encourages people to drop off their unused prescription drugs for disposal, keeping them out of children's hands. Take back days are held twice a year, once in the spring and again in the fall.

Drug Free Vigo County also facilitates the Wabash Valley Youth Leadership Summit. This annual conference is open to children entering into middle school, who are currently in middle school or going into high school. Participants of the summit walk away with a sense of empowerment that they can change their community with the power of their own voice and gain a sense of their leadership styles.

## Our Mission:

**To reduce and prevent youth substance abuse by increasing community collaboration, engaging youth in positive social activities, and providing education, training, and leadership support to parents, businesses, and individuals in the Vigo County community.**

## Seven Strategies for Change:

1. Providing information via social networking platforms
2. Providing youth/adults education and training
3. Reducing home/social access to substances
4. Supporting drug-free social events
5. Promoting drug-free school policies
6. Strengthening enforcement
7. Identifying physical design problems that increase risk
